Columbus City Attorney Zach Klein Statement Opposing Changes that would make it Harder for Citizens to Pass Constitutional Amendments

Says politicians need to trust voters to do what is best for Ohio

COLUMBUS, OH— Columbus City Attorney Zach Klein issued a statement today in opposition to House Joint Resolution (HJR) 1, a proposed constitutional amendment that would make it harder for citizens to pass any future amendments to the Ohio Constitution by removing majority rule and replacing it with a 60 percent passage threshold.

"HJR 1 is an undemocratic, unpopular and unfair power grab by extremist politicians and the special interests that bankroll their campaigns. This proposal would get rid of citizen-led ballot initiatives as we know them by stripping away the ability for the majority of voters to decide what's best for our state.

"The truth is that Ohioans already understand the gravity of what it means to amend our constitution. That's why voters have opposed more than 70 percent of citizen-initiated constitutional amendments since 1912. Time and again Ohioans have shown they take their voting responsibility seriously, and yet, the entire basis of HJR 1 is that voters can't be trusted. I reject that notion. When the majority of Ohioans speak, politicians should listen. We need to trust the voters, not limit their voice and their power. HJR 1 must be rejected."
