## Columbus City Attorney, Franklin County Commissioners, and Columbus State Community College to Announce Innovative Public Safety Program

Project Taillight Increases Community Safety by Providing Free Vehicle Light Repair for Residents in Need

COLUMBUS – Tomorrow, Tuesday, May 18, 2021, Columbus City Attorney Zach Klein will announce an innovative public safety and crime prevention program being piloted by the City Attorney's Office and the Franklin County Commissioners in partnership with Columbus State Community College. The program, Project Taillight, seeks to improve community safety by connecting low-income residents with proactive headlight, taillight, license plate light, and/or turn signal repair services for free. Services are performed by students enrolled in Columbus State's Automotive Technology Program.
